For patients without physical or physiological need for lubricant, use lukewarm water to rm and lubricate the speculum. When necessary, sparingly apply carbomer-free lubricant on the exterior of the speculum blades. not use an excessive amount of lubricant jelly to lubricate the speculum. Remove excess mucus or other discharge present before taking the nple. This should be gently removed with ring forceps holding a folded gauze pad. Remove inflammatory exudate from the cervical canal before ing the sample. Remove by placing a dry 2-by-2-inch piece of gauze over the cervix and peeling it away after it absorbs the exudate or by using a procto swab or Scopette swab. The cervix should not be cleaned by washing with saline or it may result in a relatively acellular specimen.
